Limestone carvings on the landmark Barclay-Vesey Building in Manhattan that were destroyed during the September 11 attacks have been restored to their original splendor. Although much of the exterior is brick, the feature elements of the façade are limestone, including large cubic pieces and ornately carved panels. The project required 5,000 cu. ft. of Indiana limestone with 2,000 sq. ft. of carved surface

area, and an additional 500 cu. ft. of Stony Creek granite for the base of the building.
